Desk I have been thinking about this Parish Visitor article for awhile. I have been wondering what my final message should be as we conclude our time together in the next several weeks.

This year has been filled with opportunities; opportunities to proclaim the forgiveness of sins to one another; opportunities to be confronted by God's Word about how we live with one another under the Gospel; opportunities to wrestle with how we as a congregation move into the next season of our life together under different circumstances that we have previously faced. We are anticipating welcoming new pastors; men God has identified as our next pastors. We are wondering how diminished worship attendance and school registration will affect the way both pastoral and school ministry is conducted. We face many legitimate and challenging questions.

In the midst of those questions I am drawn to Romans 15:13 where Paul brings his letter to the Roman believers to a close by pointing them back to their source of hope as they apply the teaching he has given them to their own challenging situation: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Because of who God is we have hope. He points us forward with confidence in what is to come. That doesn't necessarily mean everything will be easy; absolutely not! Hope gives us confidence that in spite of the challenges to come, we know without a doubt that God is working "for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). Because of that hope we can face the uncertainties that lie ahead with both joy and peace. Joy is not specifically happiness. Rather, joy is the constant awareness of the grace of God that bestows forgiveness and restoration no matter the circumstances. Peace is not the absence of conflict. Rather, peace is the tranquility of the soul that allows us to fear nothing and to be content in all circumstances.

Joy and peace allow us to face challenges with confidence, not fear. The joy and peace Paul describes moves us to trust in God no matter what we face, thus upholding Proverbs 3:5, which says: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding."

Paul concludes his exhortation by reminding the Romans that their ability to live this way is not because of their own strength or wisdom. It is the power of the Holy Spirit working in them that accomplishes this. As we bask in the joy and peace God showers upon us through the Gospel, the Holy Spirit stretches us and empowers us to live in that trust, peace, and joy.

My ongoing prayer for Saint John's congregation and for each member personally is that Paul's words may be words with which you step into the New Year and beyond. Our Triune God is the God of hope in the midst of uncertainty. He brings you joy and peace rather than fear. He can be trusted not matter the circumstances. And by the power of Holy Spirit you will overflow with hope as you seek God's will for you individually and corporately.

Financial challenges, changes in the pastoral office, seismic cultural shifts, these all threaten to distract us from God's sure exhortations and promises. But, as we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus (Hebrews 12:2) and the forgiveness of sins He showers upon us, "the God of hope [will] fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you [will] overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit!" 


