**“Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.” (Joshua 1:9b)**

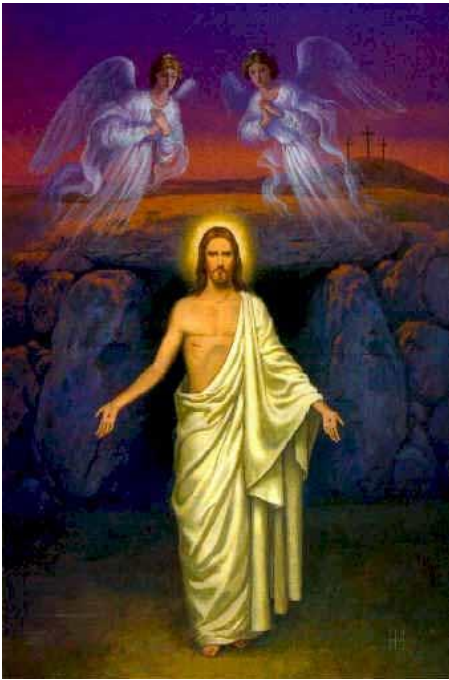

He is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia! Jesus has accomplished salvation for us; and He has come to us with this very deliverance in the washing of Baptism and the hearing of His Word so that we believe it. As we live in Him, then, we return to our study of the Seventh Commandment from Luther's Large Catechism, as found in the Book of Concord (BoC).

"We have now given warning and exhortation enough. Those who do not heed or believe this may go their own way until they learn it by experience. But it needs to be impressed upon the young people so that they may be on their guard and not go along with the old, wayward crowd but instead keep their eyes on God's commandment, lest God's wrath and punishment overtake even them. Our responsibility is only to instruct and to reprove with God's Word. But it is the responsibility of the princes and magistrates to restrain open wantonness. They should be alert and courageous enough to establish and maintain order in all areas of trade and commerce in order that the poor may not be burdened and oppressed and in order that they themselves may not be responsible for other people's sins (BoC, p. 419)."

Some may take this command—or others like it—to say that the Church and the Ten Commandments should be the Law of the land, but here Luther refutes this idea. "Our responsibility is only to instruct and to reprove with God's Word...it is the responsibility of the princes and magistrates (the government) to restrain open wantonness." There is an extent to which both the right hand and left hand kingdoms go hand-in-hand, but their responsibilities are distinguishable. The right hand kingdom (the Church) is involved in the preaching and teaching of God's Word. The left hand kingdom (the government) is involved in the making of laws and the punishment of the wicked.

Although, as Luther also well puts it, the Church can and should pray for the government leaders—that they "should be alert and courageous enough to establish and maintain order in all areas of trade," etc. Likewise, the Church can and should pray that government leaders would recognize their God-given offices as God-given, so that "they themselves may not be responsible for other people's sins."

It is in the recognition of and living out of the distinguishing of these responsibilities that both Church leaders and government leaders may please God in thanksgiving for His Son's death and resurrection for them. They may do so in those ways, and in living out all the other vocations (stations in life) into which God has placed them. The same is true for you. By living out your vocations in God-pleasing ways you give thanksgiving for all that God has done for you in Jesus.

"Enough has been said about what stealing is. It should not be narrowly restricted, but it should pertain to anything that has to do with our neighbor. We will sum it up, as we have done in the previous commandments: First, we are forbidden to do our neighbors any injury or wrong in any way imaginable, whether by damaging, withholding, or interfering with their possessions and property. We are not even to consent to or permit such a thing but are rather to avert and prevent it. In addition, we are commanded to promote and further our neighbor's interests, and when they suffer want, we are to help, share, and lend to both friends and foes.

"Anyone who seeks and desires good works will find here more than enough things to do that are heartily acceptable and pleasing to God. Moreover, God lavishes upon them a wonderful blessing, and generously rewards us for what we do to benefit and befriend our neighbor...Here you have a rich Lord, who is surely sufficient for your needs and will let you lack or want for nothing. Thus with a happy conscience you can enjoy a hundred times more than you could scrape together by perfidy and injustice (BoC, p.420)."

We have each been given clear consciences in our dear Savior Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. As God has lavished love upon us, may we lavish it upon all those we meet so that we no longer view them as "friends or foes" but as others upon whom God has lavished the same love. In the name of our *Risen* Lord Jesus Christ. Amen!

### Message from Principal: Legends of the Bible: Noah

“Now the earth was corrupt in God’s sight, and the earth was filled with violence. And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth. And God said to Noah, “I have determined to make an end of all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them with the earth. . . . Noah did this; he did all that God commanded him.” Genesis 6:11-13, 22

In Genesis, we read the description of Noah in Genesis 6:9b, “Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation. Noah walked with God.”

The description of Noah is a vast contrast to the description of the rest of the people in the world, “The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.” Genesis 6:5

It must have been extremely difficult for Noah and his family before the flood. Then God asked Noah to do the unimaginable, build an ark to house two or every kind of animal for a flood that covers the earth. WOW! Noah must have thought God was crazy! And all the people around Noah must have thought he was crazy! Imagine the ridicule Noah and his family must have had to endure. But Noah remained faithful and obedient to God.

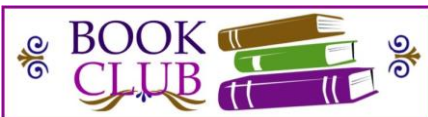
## **GROWING ST. JOHN'S**

St. John's is part of the **South Wisconsin District**. The District is divided into groups called Zones, with about 6 churches each. Each church has a society organization that is affiliated with the LWML.

We participate in Spring and Fall Rallies and host on a rotation basis with the other churches in our Zone.

The District hosts the Fall Retreat, Young Women's Retreat and SWD Convention.

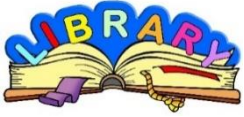

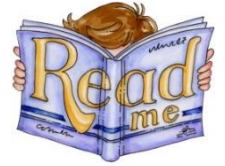

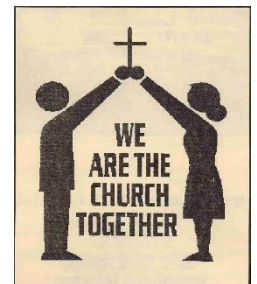


"YouCan" make a difference! Please consider donating new or gently used pairs of shoes for Belize.

Adopt a bill to date (since Nov. 2004) What IS St. John's Adopt a bill program? And how does it work? *In the Narthex on the wall, we have our 'Adopt-a-bill' Program with the graphics of Noah's ark, and helping "St. John's 'keep afloat". On the wall are miscellaneous bills that can be 'adopted' by those who would like to help out with some of our bills not necessarily covered by our 'ministry financial plan'. Most (if not all) of the bills to be 'adopted' are less than \$100. There are 'adopt-a-bill' envelopes to put your name, envelope number and selected bill and payment into. [bills 'adopted' will then be credited to your offering statement under 'adopt-a-bill]. Checks should be made out to St. John's Church [not to the recipient on the bill]; cash is also welcomed. Our 'adopt-a-bill' program was started in 2004 and since then we have over **\$223,000.00** of donations credited to miscellaneous bills. January 2024 ~ \$393.15 February 2024 ~ \$1,170.79*
