“Thus far we have heard the first part of the Christian teaching, and in it we have seen all that God wishes us to do and not to do. The Creed properly follows, which sets forth all that we must expect and receive from God; in short, it teaches us to know him perfectly. It is given in order to help us do what the Ten Commandments require of us. For, as...above, they are set so high that all human ability is far too puny and weak to keep them. Therefore it is just as necessary to learn this part as it is the other so that we may know where and how to obtain the power to do this...

“In the first place, the Creed used to be divided into twelve articles. Of course, if all the elements contained in Scripture and belonging to the Creed were gathered together, there would be many more articles, nor could they all be clearly expressed in so few words. But to make it most clear and simple for teaching to children, we shall briefly sum up

the entire Creed in three main articles, according to the three persons of the Godhead, to whom everything that we believe is related. Thus the first article, concerning God the Father, explains creation; the second, concerning the Son, redemption; the third, concerning the Holy Spirit, being made holy...One God and one faith, but three persons, and therefore also three articles or confessions (Book of Concord (BoC), pp. 431-432).”

As we enter February we continue to have God’s presence in Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior manifested to us in this season of Epiphany. Jesus’ work was attested to by both God the Father and the Spirit at His baptism, with God the Father speaking down from heaven and the Holy Spirit descending down in the form of a dove. Yet God is not three but one. One in substance (Athanasian Creed) and one in purpose. When we delve into the three separate articles, bear in mind that while we attribute Creation to God the Father, Jesus (the Word) was right there (as we learn in John 1) and the Spirit was there hovering over the waters. Likewise in redemption (as we learn from Jesus’ baptism’s account) and in Sanctifying us (even though attributed to the Holy Spirit).

God is three persons in One being who has one purpose. The Creed is one creed with three articles created for us by fellow believers (as drawn from God’s Word written down by the apostles) and handed down to us for our benefit. This year, let us learn more together about God as He is made manifest to us by His Word from the apostles in this Creed so that we may be drawn ever-closer to Him.

As we are drawn ever-closer to God, we learn how to accomplish His will (as found in the Ten Commandments) through the gift of His Holy Spirit. It has to be through His Spirit because of our own, we are poor, miserable sinners. Of our own, we could never accomplish His will in the Ten Commandments, or even in the keeping of one of them. In breaking even one of them, we break them all because we are no longer keeping God first. But thanks be to God in our Lord Jesus Christ who has given us redemption—the forgiveness of all of our sins. It is only in His name and in His grace that we can be drawn closer to God, and in step with His will through His Spirit. As always, it is all about and all because of Jesus. In Jesus’ Name. Amen.

**2025-2026 Enrollment-** Enrollment for the 2025 - 2026 school year will begin on February 1st. If you do not plan on attending St. John’s next year, you will need to call the office before April 17th to avoid the non-refundable registration fee.

**Safety Upgrades:**

Our school is in the process of conducting a thorough safety review to identify areas of improvement and a plan of implementation. Updates will be shared as we finalize details and timelines.

**Curriculum Review:**

In conjunction with our annual cycle of curriculum review, we undertook a review of our Social Studies curriculum. In efforts to ensure our curriculum stays up-to-date, free of indoctrination, aligned with our values, and applicable to our students’ lives, we completed a thorough review via a committee of teachers and the principal. It was concluded that our current curriculum remains effective and our state Forward Exam data reveals that our students score “Exceeds Expectations” in grades through 4 and through 8. We have identified a curriculum text series that we will explore cost and implementation when we decide it becomes necessary.

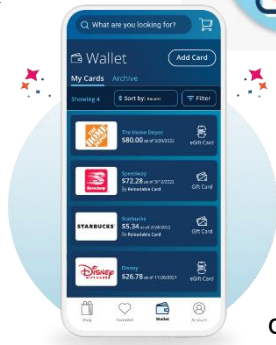

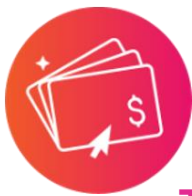

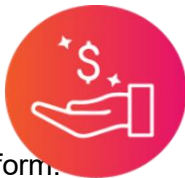
