May many more, by the Holy Spirit's power, come to receive Jesus as our Savior and Lord. This is my daily fervent prayer. "Thy Kingdom Come."

We continue Luther's discussion of the First Article as found in the Large Catechism: "For the highly educated and those somewhat more well informed...all three articles can be treated more fully and divided into as many parts as there are words. But for the young pupils it is now enough to indicate the most necessary points, namely, as we have said, that this article deals with creation. We should emphasize the words 'creator of heaven and earth.' What is meant by these words or what do you mean when you say, 'I believe in God the Father almighty, creator,' etc.? Answer: I hold and believe that I am God's creature, that is, that he has given me and constantly sustains my body, soul, and life, my members great and small, all my senses, my reason and understanding, and the like; my food and drink, clothing, nourishment, spouse and children, servants, house and farm, etc. Besides, he makes all creation help

provide the benefits and necessities of life—sun, moon, and stars in the heavens; day and night; air, fire, water, the earth and all that it yields and brings forth; birds, fish, animals, grain, and all sorts of produce. Moreover, he gives all physical and temporal blessings—good government, peace, security. Thus we learn from this article that none of us has life—or anything else that has been mentioned here or can be mentioned—from ourselves, nor can we by ourselves preserve any of them, however small and unimportant. All this is comprehended in the word 'Creator (Book of Concord (BoC), pp.432-433).'"

In Legendary Pictures' *MonsterVerse* with *Godzilla*, *King Kong*, and other giant kaiju, it is a human scientist's words which speak volumes. Dr. Serizawa is a man with a great respect for *Godzilla* as he believes that *Godzilla* is the only creature which can restore balance for our world when things go awry (such as when attacks are made by other kaiju). In "*Godzilla: King of the Monsters* (2019)", Dr. Serizawa is in a court defending his position. When asked, "So, you'd want to make *Godzilla* our pet?" Dr. Serizawa replies, "No. We will be his." The senator who asked and others scoff at the remark, but it follows another thought Serizawa had when *Godzilla* was seen back in 2014. When asked if *Godzilla* has a chance of defeating the MUTOs (Massive Unidentified Terrestrial Organisms), Serizawa replies, "The arrogance of man is thinking nature is in our control and not the other way around." This is how it is in life, only instead of being *Godzilla*'s "pets" we are God's created creatures. We human beings may be the ones with dominion over creation, but we were given that dominion by God. God is the Creator; we are His created creatures. Thankfully God is a good being and not an evil one.

God has not only created us, He also continues to provide everything that we need to sustain our bodies and lives. He orchestrates everything in such a way as to provide those things. Consider any necessity you purchase at the store. Did it just magically get there? Or did it come from somewhere? From a farm? Did it just magically grow on that farm, or did God provide a farmer? Did God not also provide the soil with the nutrients; the correct amount of sunlight and rain? Did God not also provide truck drivers to get the item from the farm to processing places, processors? And at the store, did God provide cashiers to help you make your purchase? Moreover, has not God provided you with a job to make money to buy those groceries? Has He not given you the talents and abilities and strength to do your work? And all that thought is only regarding the one necessity you began thinking about at the beginning of this exercise, let alone everything else that you need.

"Moreover, we also confess that God the Father has given us not only all that we have and what we see before our eyes, but also that he daily guards and defends us against every evil and misfortune, warding off all sorts of danger as a kind father who cares for us so that no evil may befall us. But further discussion of this subject belongs in the other two parts of this article, where it says, 'Father almighty (BoC, p.433).'"

As we conclude our Lenten devotions, watch our Lord Jesus pray in the garden of Gethsemane, suffer and be forsaken by God in our places, die, and on the Third Day rise again, we remember and acknowledge that He did all that for us. As we contemplate them further, we remember that God has not only given us salvation, but we remember that all First Article gifts are out of His fatherly, divine goodness and mercy as well, without any merit on our parts. Let us ever be thankful for all that God has done for us, not only what God the Son has done for us by His suffering, death, and resurrection, but also what the Spirit has given us in giving us faith, and in what the Father has given us by His creative hand.

"Praise God from whom all blessings flow, Praise Him, all creatures here below; Praise Him above, ye heavenly host: Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Amen. (LSB 805)" In the name of our crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.” – Matthew 11:28

As we embrace this time, let us do so with gratitude, trusting that God uses moments of rest to restore both body and soul. May we all take time, whether on break or not, to reflect on the blessings He provides, to dwell in His Word, and to find peace in His presence. And when we return to our work and daily callings, may we do so with renewed strength, ready to serve Him with joy. “He makes me lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside quiet waters, He refreshes my soul” (Psalm 23:2-3). Amen.

St. John's is part of the **South Wisconsin District**. The District is divided into groups called Zones, with about 6 churches each. Each church has a society organization that is affiliated with the LWML.

We participate in Spring and Fall Rallies and host on a rotation basis with the other churches in our Zone.

The District hosts the Fall Retreat, Young Women's Retreat and SWD Convention.



can be picked up following the 9:00am Easter Service. Flowers have labels on them for easier pick up. *Reminder that the church is closed on Monday, April 21st.




